

THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, CHESHAM (WATER MAIN WORKS)) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER, 2012

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL has made an Order, which will temporarily prohibit any vehicle from proceeding, except for access, in those lengths of various roads in Chesham as specified in the Schedule below.

The alternative routes for vehicles affected by the individual closures are specified in the Schedule below.

The closure is required whilst water main replacement works take place and it is anticipated that the works will commence on 9 January 2012 and will take place on the dates specified in the Schedule below.

During the subsistence of this Order "The Buckinghamshire County Council (MC63 Waterside and Moor Road, Chesham) (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1994" will be temporarily suspended insofar as it relates to the no entry restriction on Moor Road, Chesham.

The Order will come into operation on 9 January 2012 when the appropriate signs are lawfully displayed and will continue in force for a period of 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier.

Penalties for not observing these restrictions will be as prescribed by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

SCHEDULE ("AR = Alternative Route)

East Street, Chesham. From its junction with Red Lion Street for a distance of approximately 16 metres to its junction with Townfield. 09/01/2012 to 13/02/2012. AR – Red Lion Street, St. Mary's Way, White Hill, The Backs and Station Road and vice versa. **Waterside, Chesham**. From Red Lion Street to its junction with Hospital Hill. 13/02/2012 to 09/04/2012. AR – Amersham Road, Moor Road, Waterside and vice versa.

Market Square, Chesham. From junction with Red Lion Street to its junction with High Street. 10/04/2012 to 24/04/2012.

High Street, Chesham. From its junction with Station Road to its junction with Market Square, a distance of 200 metres. 23/04/2012 to 04/06/2012.

King Street, Chesham. From its junction with German Street for a distance of approximately 130 metres. 25/05/2012 to 19/06/2012. AR – Amy Lane, Amersham Road, Red Lion Street, Watermeadow, German Street and vice versa.

The no entry restriction on Moor Road, Chesham will be temporarily suspended to facilitate the diversion route for the Waterside, Chesham closure.

Highways Working Party Meeting – 1 December 2011

Held at Town Hall at 10.30am

Present:

Cllrs Mohammad Fayyaz (MF), Alison Pirouet (AP), Mark Shaw (MS) and Chris Spruytenburg (CS) - Chesham Town Council;

An apology for absence was received from Derek Lacey (DL).

Introductions

AMD introduced herself and her role. She explained she was the new Transport Localities Team Leader for Chiltern District and South Bucks following a recent reorganisation. She also advised that MB would be remaining as the designated Area Technician for Chesham and surrounding villages.

BR introduced the Members on the working party and advised that it had been formed to look at the many perceived highway infrastructure deficiencies within town and how they could best be addressed.

2. **Update of Chesham Highways**

MB reported back on the tour of Chesham's roads undertaken by DL, Peter Hardy BCC portfolio holder for Planning &Transportation, Chris Thomas, Transport for Buckinghamshire and him. He explained that the tour had taken in both major roads and estate residential roads to ascertain the scale of the problem and, he opined, that he believed it had been instructive for Councillor Hardy. MF enquired whether the tour had inspected the road list supplied by CTC. MB responded by saying it looked at some but the tour was already aware of these problems so mainly they looked at those not regularly reported to ensure that Councillor Hardy had a feel of the state of the roads generally in Chesham.

AMD advised that the tour had taken place before the recent investment in a works programme had taken effect and she hoped that the town would start to see real improvements in the short and medium term. MB also said that, following a reassessment of work procedures, Transport for Buckinghamshire (TfB) was looking at the feasibility of repairing Category 1 & 2 potholes at the same time if located near to each other.

The working party then briefly discussed potholes. CS opined that he believed many potholes were filled but not sealed and MF enquired as to whether the work was ever checked. AMD admitted it was impossible to check works in any meaningful way but did urge Councillors to report examples of poor workmanship directly to her. MB stated there would be every effort to systematically tackle potholes but he only had the hole fixing gangs for two weeks at a time on a periodic basis.

MS opined that it was apparent efforts were, at last, being made to undertake significant repairs and gave the example of Hivings Hill. He further suggested that the public was starting to realise this and complaints he received as a local Member were reducing.

AP asked whether officers at TfB had any say in what highways were to be repaired. MB said the decisions lay with BCC Members but officers tried to guide where possible.

AMD then confirmed that significant repairs for Berkhampstead Road, Red Lion Street and Broad Street were planned for this financial year. She agreed to circulate a timetable via BR. This was agreed as being very positive but CS suggested that after works were completed, regular maintenance was important.

AP enquired as to whether any monies would be re-allocated to repairs and upgrades to pavements. AMD advised that they would have a better idea on budgets for 2012/13 by February.

3. Weeding

MS stated that high verge-side weeds in Little Hivings remained and other Members cited other examples. AMD agreed to chase up a schedule list and to send BR for distribution to Members.

MS left the meeting at 11.00am

4. Salt Bins

AMD reported that salt bins were only replaced now if seriously damaged rather than if they had a hole in them. The working party briefly discussed winter maintenance and BR reported that TfB had supplied the Depot with rock salt in preparation for any bad weather and the subsequent need to grit the High Street.

5. Street lighting

Members gave examples of when street lights had been out for some time, been regularly reported but not been repaired. MB agreed to investigate. BR reported that TfB switchboard had been telling callers that lights in unadopted roads were the responsibility of CTC when in fact they were the responsibility of the developers. Hopefully this had now been rectified.

6. Cycling

BR advised that CTC's Cycling Working Party had met with the BCC's Cycling Officer recently and it appeared that there was scope for improving certain cycling routes without incurring great expenditure. The Cycling Officer had agreed to put a few ideas on paper with indicative costs and forward to BR

BR thanked Members, AMD and MB for their time. It was agreed to meet again sometime in the Spring and the meeting concluded at 11.20am.

We're Working On It (Design & Construction/Area Maintenance)

As part of the We're Working On It capital works programme County Councillors have identified their Top 5 priority sites as have your Local Area Technicians.

Transport for Buckinghamshire's engineers have then been out to visit and assess each site to confirm both the extent of the works required as well as the most appropriate carriageway treatment, with the intention of extending the life of the road by at least 7 years.

The following explains the various types of treatment available.

Surfacing: Replacement of the existing road surface

<u>Slurry Seal</u>: A form of surfacing that smoothes out minor imperfections and gives a clean road finish

<u>Plane & Patch</u>: This involves planing out sections of road and replacing with a new surface

<u>Surface Dressing</u>: Spraying the road with hot bitumen and then covering with stone chippings

Please note that the treatments noted above are weather dependant and whilst we have provided an anticipated start date these may change.

The table below shows the current list of streets, sections of which are expected to receive one of the treatments (noted above), over the next two years.

Summary

1. To consider a possible extra bid for the Delegated Budget scheme for 2012/13.

Background Information

2. At the Development Control Committee Meeting of the 12th December 2011, the Committee agreed to re-submit the projects for the 2012/13 Delegated Budget scheme previously agreed at the Council Meeting of the 18th April 2011 other than the barriers for Market Square and the widening of the entrance at Chiltern Hills Academy (formerly Chesham Park Community College). It was also agreed to submit three projects recommended by the Buckinghamshire County Council Area Technician, namely a grasscreting project in Black Horse Lane, erection of bollards in Marston Close and installation of planters in Germain Street.

Detailed Consideration

6. The Buckinghamshire County Council Transport Localities Team for this area sent the following e-mail to Councillor Mrs Littley early in the New Year.

'I have been chatting to some of my policy colleagues, one of whom deals with flooding, to see if there are any proposals to help minimise the amount of water reaching Germain Street.

As I am sure you are aware currently water is flowing down from Fullers Hill, where there is a very limited drainage system, and collecting in Germain Street. The silt that is carried in this water clogs the drains and makes them ineffective

therefore even clearing the drains every two months may not resolve the issues here.

One possible solution to this, that is proposed in the linked file (page 19), is to create some sort of water collection point in the verge at the junction of Fullers Hill with Fullers Close. Whilst a scheme has not been designed here a water collection point, or soakaway, could well help reduce the amount of water travelling down into Germain Street.

My colleague has included this proposal and a vague estimate of between £26-50k budget to take this bid forward for funding however this is obviously one of a number of schemes and the benefits are likely to only cover a small number of households.

Therefore, I was wondering whether you would agree to asking the Town Council to consider submitting a delegated budget bid for this scheme. I am aware we do not yet know the extent of the delegated budget, that this would take up most, if not all of the budget, and that this would be up against multiple other schemes in the area but wondered what your thoughts were regarding this?'

7. In light of this, Councillor Mrs Littley has asked whether this could be debated as a late bid to the Delegated Budget at Development Control on Monday evening.

Recommendation

That the Committee considers whether it wishes to support a remedial scheme to tackle excess water in Germain Street in the form of a water collection point in Fuller's Hill and whether this be agreed as an official Delegated Budget bid.
