# CHESHAM & DISTRICT TRANSPORT USERS' GROUP

Notes of a Meeting held at Chesham Town Hall on Tuesday, 19th September 2023 at 7.30pm

Present: Roderick McCulloch (Chairman), Alan Wallwork (Secretary), plus Glenn de Sousa, Head of Commercial and Planning, Oxford Bus Company incorporating Carousel Buses.

In attendance: 20 TUG members and members of the public

Glenn de Sousa gave a slide presentation outlining the services operated by Carousel Buses locally and highlighted some of the issues faced in providing those services. He also made reference to a number of service improvements introduced as part of the recent timetable changes, which had been notified to and agreed by Buckinghamshire Council.

Amongst those changes, were the provision of a morning and evening service to Amersham School which although he recognised was still not ideal, was implemented as a result of the concerns expressed at the Meeting between parents and himself and Shaun Ritchie, Head of Operations, Oxford Bus Company in January 2023, which was organised by Chesham TUG.

It was also mentioned that new buses ordered for Oxford Bus Company in 2024 would allow newer, more fuel efficient buses to be cascaded into our area.

The Meeting then turned into a Question and Answer session.

Amongst the questions raised were those related to:-

- Those living along the A413 in affordable housing in the Amersham area who had been attracted by the promise of bus services were now left stranded, as many could not afford cars nor even had driving licences.
- Whilst changes to the 106/107 had given Little Chalfont improved services, those whose properties were no longer served by them had lost out.
- As a result of the changes noted above, many people had had to leave their jobs as they could no longer reach their place of work by public transport e.g. Amersham Council Depot workers.
- Whilst it was admitted that there had been little or no public consultation, all changes had been cleared with the County Council in advance. In addition, the County Council alone was responsible for putting up notices at all bus stops, advising of the changes.
- Attention was drawn to the lack of direct services to and from Stoke Mandeville Hospital following the withdrawal of Route 55 and prior to that, the withdrawal of the Woottons' services. Glenn pointed out that Carousel wasn't responsible for operating Route 55 and it was understood that the service was only viable thanks to a subsidy from the NHS to enable nurses to move between Stoke Mandeville and Amersham Hospitals. Once that subsidy was removed, the service was no longer viable commercially.
- Questions were asked about wheelchair accessibility on Carousel's buses and the number of available wheelchair spaces. It was confirmed that drivers were trained to help users of the ramp and that only the newer buses had more than one wheelchair space.

- Concern was expressed at the withdrawal of the 103 to Watford and 105 to Uxbridge. Glenn pointed out that in respect of the former, Arriva had now introduced the 336 to Watford and as for the 105, it had become uneconomic.
- Whilst a new operator had recently introduced two early morning services to LHR, it was noted that there were no corresponding return services and Carousel had no plans to operate similar services during the day as it was felt that London Underground provided adequate cover via the Piccadilly Line.
- Glenn explained that where services were felt to be uneconomic, unless a Council subsidy was available, there was no chance of anyone operating those routes. After discussion on the criteria for a subsidy, the Secretary was asked to invite someone from the County Council to attend a future meeting to explain their rationale and the likely pot of money available for subsidies.
- Glenn confirmed that Carousel's targets for the future included improved punctuality and service standards, although punctuality was often adversely affected by numerous road works.
- The Meeting was reminded that adult bus fares were currently capped at a maximum fare of £2 for a single journey until 31<sup>st</sup> October. Carousel were no better and no worse off as a result, thanks to a Central Government grant.
- In response to a question, it was reported that the Wycombe pick-me-up service contained a rural mobility element.

The Chairman ended the meeting by giving a Vote of Thanks to Glenn for his comprehensive review of Carousel's operations and for facing lively questioning for about an hour.
