24/11 Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from Mark Brookes, Georgina Lomnitz, Geoff Povey, Hilary Povey and Graham Read.

24/12 Minutes of the Meeting of 9th January 2024

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 9th January 2024 were approved and signed.

24/13 Matters Arising

AW confirmed he had forwarded the Group's responses regarding the County Council's Medium Term Financial Plan to Cllr.Nick Southworth in order to meet the required deadline for comments.

24/14 Report From The Treasurer

PCW reported that £147.42 was currently in hand and that known planned expenditure amounted to £35. He then collected further £2 annual subs from those present who had not paid previously.

24/15 Federation of Met Line User Committees (FOMLUC)

AW was endeavouring to arrange a meeting in order that a new Treasurer could be appointed amongst other things.

24/16 Ongoing Met Line Issues

Various issues were reported, amongst which were:-

- Numerous examples of train cancellations.
- Departure times displayed on the Board at Chesham Station on Saturday 10th February were incorrect and therefore unhelpful.
- Ongoing points and signal failures continued to adversely impact services.
- Earlier this evening, delays were experienced due to a trespasser on the line.

24/17 Local Bus Services

The following issues were reported:-

- Arriva had now re-branded all services from Aylesbury with a 'X' prefix.
 Confusingly, this has led to the situation whereby two separate unconnected routes branded "X6" now operate in Milton Keynes.
- There were no timetable changes currently planned.
- Oxford Bus Company now had the required funding to replace its fleet of double deckers with electric vehicles, which meant that the displaced buses would be cascaded down into the Carousel bus routes operating in our area. As a result, buses with LHR Flightline branding were likely to be seen in Chesham, although that did not indicate a resumption of a service to the Airport.
- Redline Buses is also updating its fleet and Red Rose would receive its displaced vehicles.
- Some County Councils facing financial difficulties were now withdrawing subsidies for buses in its area, such as Hampshire.
- PCW reported on local diversions affecting bus services in and around Chesham.
- RM reported that in a recent meeting he attended at which Guy Opperman MP was present, he heard GO confirm that the maximum £2 single bus fare would definitely continue until the end of 2024.

24/18 TfL Fares

AW reported that the Mayor of London recently announced that as from 1st March 2024 TfL would charge off-peak fares all day on its rail services each Friday for a trial period of 3 months in an attempt to win back lost customers following the reduction in usage experienced since the Covid-19 pandemic.

In addition, the Mayor announced that Pay As You Go single fares will be frozen on bus, tube, tram DLR services and the majority of such fares on London Overground and the Elizabeth Line until March 2025.

AW cautioned that the devil was in the detail and it didn't mean that all fares would be held at current levels and should be double checked on the TfL website if passengers were in any doubt.

24/19 Circular Tube Maps

Attention was drawn to a paper circulated with the Agenda showing a picture of circular tube maps which were appearing at various London Underground stations.

It contained various inaccuracies and was in fact merely an advertisement for the Samsung Galaxy S24 smartphone.

24/20 Railfuture Meeting 17th January 2024

RM gave a short resume of a Meeting he attended in London on behalf of Chesham TUG on 17th January. Further meetings were planned on 19th February and 21st March and it was felt important that we should continue to be represented there if possible.

24/21 Wheelchair Accessible Taxis in Chesham and Amersham

The Meeting was reminded that some months ago, Chesham TUG was approached by the Amersham and Chesham MS Group regarding the lack of local taxis able to accommodate wheelchair users without the need for them to vacate the chair. It is a local community group affiliated with the MS Society dedicated to making a positive

difference to the lives of those living with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) in the area and it was hoped that Chesham TUG could use its influence to discover the reason there were no suitable vehicles in either town.

As a result of this approach, RM and AW on behalf of Chesham TUG had made contact with the appropriate people within the Licensing Department of the County Council and a series of meetings had now been held with them in which it was highlighted that whilst there were numerous such taxis in Aylesbury and High Wycombe, there were none in Chesham or Amersham.

RM gave details of what had been discussed and it was noted that representatives from Swan Rider and other operators had attended recent meetings.

These meetings would be ongoing and regular updates would be provided to this Meeting.

24/22 Any Other Business

- AW drew attention to a current appeal for volunteer drivers by Dial a Ride.
- The Meeting was informed of a possible strike announced by the RMT on London Overground and parts of the Elizabeth Line on 4th and 5th March, although it was hoped it might be called off.
- PCW drew attention to a Consultation about revised hours of charging in local car parks, including implementing parking charges on Sundays. There was also a proposal to install paid parking bays next to Chalfont & Latimer Station.
